St Francis College Spiritual Direction Formation Program

Philosophy of formation

Spiritual Direction is a charism and a call of God. Our approach is contemplative and draws on the wisdom of the traditions of this Ministry as well as the lived experience of participants.

The Spiritual Direction Formation Program

This program offers participants an opportunity, with experienced Spiritual Directors, to both discern the call to this ministry and develop their practice in companioning others in their interior journeys.

Course outline description

This formation program is made up of both theoretical and practical studies conducted in a contemplative learning environment using the contemplative evocative model of Spiritual Direction. This model aims to integrate a contemplative stance in the student and the adoption of a contemplative stance towards their directees. It is evocative because its underlying philosophy is to evoke personal and spiritual growth in the student which will flow on to their directees.

Course structure

Four years part time study made up of 250 contact hours of outcome based contemplative learning and 96 hours of Spiritual Direction Practicum comprising 72 hours of group/peer and personal supervision, and 24 hours of engagement in individual spiritual direction.

Course delivery

The contemplative learning program is delivered online/blended, in two, 4-day intensives a year (64 contact hours). One in first semester, usually April/May, and one in second semester, usually October. Intensives usually run from Tuesday to Friday from 9.00 am to 4.30 pm each day. Attendance and participation at each intensive is compulsory.
